In the fall of 2019, we reached a major goal within our organization. A new partnership was formed by merging the Mahaska Community Development Group and the Oskaloosa Chamber. Together this partnership will work on utilizing economic development resources to efficiently and effectively grow the economy and enhance the quality of life even more.

- Coordinate efforts to improve the availability of housing in Mahaska Community
- Lead efforts to address workforce development challenges
- Improve the quality of life and environment in the community with a focus on quality recreation, education, jobs, and arts

Workforce

Presented to North Mahaska High School Career Exploration Program

Held 5th annual Job Fair at the Penn Central Mall with 35 employers present and approximately 170 job seekers.

Workforce committee held 1st annual Manufacturing Day at William Penn.

Business Development

New Main Street businesses. in 2019 include Muse Music Store, Loco CJ's, Enchanted Gifts, Pizza Den, Eunoia Counseling and Elevate Counseling Services. This was a net of 5 new businesses in the district.



4 Rehabilitation Projects in downtown Oskaloosa totaling \$3,325,910. This makes a total of \$23,453,276 since 1989 when Main Street was established. In addition, Oskaloosa Main

Street acted as the communications liaison for the Downtown Facade Revitalization projects.

Attended 3 IDOT meetings throughout the state of Iowa in conjunction with the Chair of the East Central Iowa Transportation Coalition Committee to advocate for a northwest bypass around the Oskaloosa community. The bypass is now in the IDOT 5-year plan.

Completed 137 business visits, including 30 Synchronist visits. The 2018 Mahaksa County Synchronist report was completed and distributed in February to business leaders in Mahaska County.

\$150,000 Revolving Loan awarded to Kelderman Manufacturing for equipment expansion.

Conducted over 15 community tours, showcasing the amenities and great things happening.

Oskaloosa Main Street awarded one facade grant to Mobile Device Repair and assisted others through the design process.



Welcomed 80 teachers from around the region for Educators in the Workplace program.

Tourism & Quality of Life

- Welcomed 100 visitors to the BioWorld Congress at the Cargill Complex.
- The Painting with Lights project expanded to more downtown buildings.
- •The Lighted Christmas Parade boasted over 70 entries and was held on a Saturday for the first time in history.
- 3,060 ears of corn were served at Sweet Corn Serenade. Visitors from 2 countries, 4 states and 13 lowa counties enjoyed this summer event.
- Hosted and promoted several community events including: Eggs & Issues, Scholarship Golf Outing, Friday After Five's, Christmas in July, 4H FFA BBQ, Sweet Corn Serenade, Movies in the Park, Trick or Treat Parade, and the Lighted Christmas Parade and festivities.
- Guided high school classes with community clean-up projects and partnered with United Way for Day of Caring projects.
- Assisted the Oskaloosa retailers with quarterly events and promotion.

Housing

- Housing committee established vacant lot inventory and explored the possibility of filling these lots.
- Gathered data and metrics to determine what housing is needed in the community.
- Visited the Homes for Iowan's program in Newton, Iowa.



- Oskaloosa Area Chamber & Development Group and Mahaska Community Development Group will be merging in 2020 as the Mahaska Chamber & Development Group. There were many strategic planning sessions and volunteer hours in 2019 for this process.
- 2,190 volunteer hours were dedicated to the Oskaloosa Area Chamber and Main Street events valued at \$55,691.
- \$35,500 sold in Osky Cash to be spent at local Chamber members.
- Oskaloosa has been a Main Street Community for 33 years.
- The Chamber held several Lunch & Learns, including Fire Safety training with hands-on fire extinguishers. Several businesses also hosted Business After Hours events.
- Mahaska County Ag & Rural Development assisted Leighton through the Mahaska County Community Foundation grant to keep their post office building updated and open for business.
- Assisted 15+ entrepreneurs with potential business info and ideas for start-up businesses.
- 6 Historical Building Markers were placed in the Main Street district, all of which are showcased on our website at oacdg.org/history.
